500.4 Admission of Homeschooled Minor Students Policy

Homeschooled students, who have attained the age of 16, but not their legal majority of 18, are required to take the College Placement Test and achieve passing scores in Reading, Writing and Math (but not Algebra) in order to take classes. The Placement Test can be waived if students meet one of the exemptions. Students failing to meet the test standard will be required to pass the GED exam and thereafter retake the placement test and/or pursue remediation as indicated by the Placement Test.

In all cases, students under the age of 18 will be required to have a signed, parental-enrollment consent form in order to register. The form, called the Parent/Guardian Release for Students Under 18, is available in the Counseling and Advising Center.

Eligible homeschooled minor students may take two courses, or up to 8 credits, each semester. Permission to take more than two courses can be granted by the Chief Student Affairs Officer after receiving a written request by the student and parent/guardian.
