Four Areas of Need at Sussex



Student Success

Here at SCCC, more than 70% of our students rely on some kind of financial assistance to afford their education. This fall, the Foundation was able to award a total of \$160,000 to deserving students from a total of 95 annual and endowed scholarships. 
Faculty & Staff Support

Student success depends on having dedicated and accomplished faculty and staff. Faculty must be trained, not only in their field of study, but also in academic advising and technology. We also need specialized staff in our Writing Center and Disability Office to meet the diverse needs of our students. We want to recruit and retain passionate educators who understand their role in a community college environment. Strategic hiring of faculty and staff also contributes to campus diversity, and makes us a competitive employer in the academic marketplace.



Academic Support

The career and technical education programs at Sussex County Community College are critical to maintaining a sustainable skilled workforce. Academic programs at the College, such as Medical Assistant, Culinary Arts, Electrical Linesworker, Optics Technology, Exercise Science, and Automotive Service Technology were designed to meet the needs of our region. The Foundation collaborates with the College's faculty and staff to raise awareness and support, building partnerships to advance our academic programs.



Innovation Fund

We must ensure that SCCC has the resources and partnerships to continue innovating and sustain essential projects for years to come. The American Center for Optics Manufacturing, also known as AmeriCOM, has recently embarked on a \$34 million project intended to help strengthen and boost the domestic precision optics industry. Sussex is the first community college in the nation to come on board as an AmeriCOM partner. SCCC will receive as much as \$2 million to support the College's Optics Technology Program to purchase the necessary equipment to train workers in optics technology. Through the Securing Our Children's Future Bond Act, SCCC will receive a total of \$1.15 million through the state and the county to construct a 2,500 square foot addition to Building R to become the Optics Technology Center on our main campus.
