#### **Academics**

Faculty and administrators were invited to Ramapo College for a first-of-its-kind articulation signing. Three 2+3 master's track program agreements were signed, including a Business A.S. to M.B.A., a Human Services A.S. to an M.S.W., and an Education A.A. to an M.A.

The Phi Theta Kappa honor society celebrated its induction of new members. Led by PTK advisor and English Instructor Daniel Warhol, this celebration joyfully recognized our hard-working and high-achieving students.

The Opening Reception of the Spring Student Artwork Showcase will be on May 2, 5-7 p.m., in the PAC Atrium.

The College will host a free Health Fair on May 5 in the PAC from Noon to 3 pm. Medical Assistant students will screen attendees for blood pressure, cholesterol levels, hemoglobin levels, BMI, and other health indicators during the event.

# Many capital projects are in different phases including:

- Construction on the Optics Technology lab began with digging the foundation for the building extension.
- Work on the Adult Transition Center building continues during Phase 2 with electrical and data.
- The Learning Commons bid was awarded. Work has begun securing permits and planning project phases. The library functions will be moved to the E-Building during renovation.

Upgrades at the Public Safety Training Academy include new multimedia, carpeting, and classroom furniture. A bid to reconfigure the basement for an egress and training space for local police was submitted to the board. Planning and sitework will also begin on an outdoor shooting range.

The College is moving forward with a suggestion made by the environmental club and supported by the Student Government Association to create an on-campus community garden near the greenhouse.



The Foundation submitted a \$25,000 request to the John and Margaret Post Foundation to support the purchase of equipment for the College's Allied Health programs. The Post Foundation has generously supported the Foundation over the past 3 years.



The Foundation continues collaborating with faculty and staff on several grant opportunities, with funding requests for allied health, the Adult Transition Center, the Art Gallery, and the anthropology department.
